

Child Poverty in America 2018: State Analysis



September 26, 2019

State data released by the U.S. Census Bureau on September 26, 2019 reveal that child poverty remains a crisis across our nation despite progress in some states. Only 5 states experienced significant decreases in child poverty from 2017, and one state (Arkansas) saw a statistically significant increase. Overall, children were still the poorest age group in America. More than 1 in 5 children were poor in 14 states and the District of Columbia. Young children and children of color fared the worst. In all but Vermont and the District of Columbia, poverty rates were higher among children under 6 than among children 6-17. Only two states—West Virginia and Kentucky—had White, non-Hispanic child poverty rates over 20 percent, whereas only four states had Black child poverty rates under 20 percent. In order to end child poverty, we must ensure all parents and caregivers have the resources to support and nurture their children: jobs with livable wages, affordable high-quality child care, supports for working families like the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and the Child Tax Credit (CTC), and safety nets for basic needs like nutrition and housing assistance.

Five States Experienced Statistically Significant Drops in Child Poverty Since 2017

Five states saw statistically significant decreases in child poverty rates between 2017 and 2018. A statistically significant change meant the change observed could not be attributed to sampling error or random chance. One state, Arkansas, saw a statistically significant increase in child poverty from 22.5 percent in 2017 to 24.7 percent in 2018.

Child Poverty Rates in 2018

Child poverty varied widely from state to state in 2018, ranging from 9.5 percent in Utah to 27.8 percent in Mississippi. In 14 states and the District of Columbia, more than 1 in 5 children were poor. Poverty is defined as an annual income below \$25,465 for a family of four with two children, which divides out to about \$2,122 a month, \$490 a week or \$70 a day.

Young Children Continue to Suffer from Higher Poverty Rates

In 2018, poverty rates for children under 6 ranged from 10.1 percent in Utah to 29.9 percent in Mississippi. In all but Vermont and the District of Columbia, poverty rates were higher among children under 6 than among children 6-17. In seven states, at least 1 in 4 children under 6 lived in poverty. No states had less than 10 percent of young children in poverty.

Extreme Child Poverty

In 2018, the percent of children living in extreme poverty ranged from 3.9 percent in Utah to 14.3 percent in Mississippi. In seven states and the District of Columbia, at least 10 percent of children lived in extreme poverty—defined as an annual income of less than half of the poverty level or \$12,823 a year, \$1,061 a month, \$245 a week or \$35 a day for the average family of four.

Extreme Child Poverty among Children Under Six

In 2018, the percent of children under 6 living in extreme poverty ranged from 4.5 percent in Utah to 17 percent in Mississippi. In 15 states and the District of Columbia, at least 10 percent of children under 6 were extremely poor.

Child Poverty by Race/Ethnicity

Across the states, children of color continue to suffer disproportionately from poverty—with the youngest children of color experiencing the highest rates of poverty.

Black Children

- In 2018, poverty rates for Black children ranged from 3.6 percent in Hawaii to 44.9 percent in Arkansas. In 11 states, at least 40 percent of Black children were poor. Only four states—Alaska, Hawaii, Maine, and Maryland—had fewer than 20 percent of Black children living in poverty.

Hispanic Children

- In 2018, poverty rates for Hispanic children ranged from 10.4 percent in Alaska to 37.7 percent in Alabama. In six states, more than 1 in 3 Hispanic children were living in poverty.

White, Non-Hispanic Children

- White, non-Hispanic children had the lowest poverty rates. In 2018, poverty rates for White, non-Hispanic children ranged from 5.7 percent in Connecticut to 23.3 percent in West Virginia. No states had more than 25 percent of White, non-Hispanic children living in poverty.

Asian, Native Hawaiian, and Other Pacific Islander Children

- In 2018, the poverty rate for Asian, Native Hawaiian, and other Pacific Islander children ranged from 3.5 percent in Missouri to 28.7 percent in Arkansas. Five states had Asian, Native Hawaiian, and other Pacific Islander child poverty rates above 20 percent. In 21 states and the District of Columbia, fewer than 10 percent of Asian, Native Hawaiian, and other Pacific Islander children were poor.

American Indian and Alaska Native Children

- In 2018, the poverty rate for American Indian and Alaska Native children ranged from 9.6 percent in New Jersey to 60.1 percent in Mississippi and South Dakota. In 10 states, more than 1 in 3 American Indian and Alaska Native children were poor.

Children of Two or More Races

- In 2018, the poverty rate for children of two of more races ranged from 8.9 percent in Maryland to 38.2 percent in West Virginia. Thirteen states had a poverty rate of 25 percent or more for children of two or more races.
